President's Message

November 2025

This fall our guild scheduled workshops to further our three new Comfort Quilt initiatives. The workshop organizers are delighted with the positive outcomes — the results from all three sessions exceeded the team's expectations.

Our area representative for Comfy Cases recently posted on their website, "So absolutely grateful for the amazing women at the Ancaster Quilt Guild. They heard that Hamilton's need for cases had increased, and they answered the call!" As of November 5th, 247 pillow cases have been donated for distribution to McMaster Sick Children's hospital and Ronald McDonald House. The response to this initiative has far exceeded our goal; by month end more than 300 pillow cases will be been submitted.

Creating fidget quilts has made many of us more aware of the community's needs — especially the importance of providing tools that help children with attention challenges and offer calming effects for seniors. We hope to continue producing fidget quilts to meet these ongoing needs.

In addition, we continue to distribute quilts within the community, and contribute to fundraising efforts by donating quilts to local groups.

In closing, our guild should be very proud of the many ways we support our community — simply by doing what we love most: sewing!

Finally, a reminder that our *Block of the Month* project will be introduced at next week's meeting — always something to look forward to and another challenge to satisfy our creative and competitive spirits!

If you're not planning or unable to attend the November 19th meeting, please let me know so I can get other members to bring in a snack.


